Note 1: JSP and E-Track Exchange students usually register between 16 and 20 credits. For students on the Japan Studies Program, this includes 8 credits of Japanese Language Cours

Note 2: The transfer of credits is at the discretion of your home institution. Please contact your university's Academic Registrar's Office to confirm if the courses you wish to take are eligible for credit transfer. As a general reference, 1 TIU credit = 1 USA credit = 2 ECTS credits = 4 UK credits. Different credit systems and/or conversion ratios might apply.
